Tasting Bee April 17, 2010

Can you believe it? It's that time of year again to start planning for the Tasting Bee, which is being held on Saturday, April 17, 2010. For those who are new, "What is the Tasting Bee?" . . . It is the LWML spring fundraiser. This year's theme is "Tied to Mom's Apron Strings".

There are three ways to get involved in the Tasting Bee:

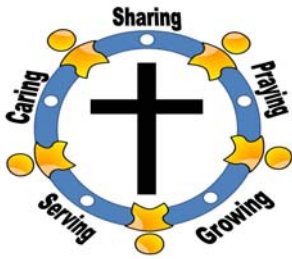

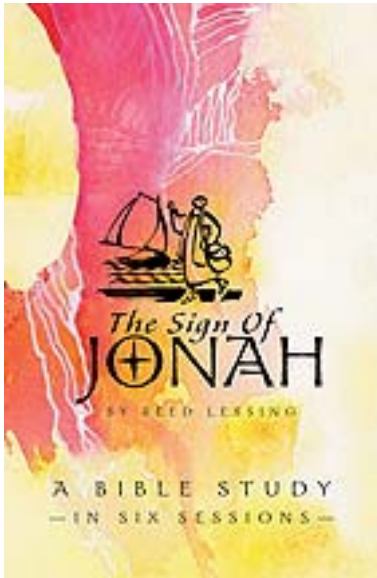

During this Bible study, we will explore Christian themes from the *Prince Caspian* movie based upon the book by C.S. Lewis. Lewis had what could be called a biblical imagination. In this sequel to *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe*, the four Pevensie children return to Narnia to aid Prince Caspian in his struggle for the throne against his corrupt uncle, King Miraz. Each evening we gather together, we will view a quarter of the film and explore the Christian themes present in the film.



HAMMER OF GOD

The *HAMMER OF GOD* is a most remarkable novel. It has the drama, the suspense, the intensity, and the description of persons, of culture, and of nature. The reader gets totally immersed in the unfolding story as well as fully engaged in the many mindboggling and heart-wrenching dialogues. A remarkable feature of this novel is that it actually is a trilogy made up of three novellas, each taking the reader to different historic eras while the local setting is the same rural area in Sweden.

Holding the reader in a grip like a good detective story, the unfolding events present a spiritual drama of death and life, of despair and hope, of upheaval and peace, of sin and grace – all experienced in everyday life by real people in their relation to the Church and her message.

In this bestselling novel, three pastors learn the necessity of relying on God's grace. They fall short of their pastoral duties through public humiliation, self-doubt, inability to accept God's promises in their own lives, and divisions and quarreling among their parishioners. Ultimately each man rejects temptations and permits the Holy Spirit to work through him.

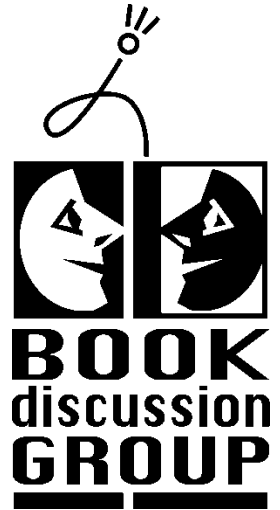
