Tasting Bee April 17, 2010

Can you believe it? It's that time of year again to start planning for the Tasting Bee, which is being held on Saturday, April 17, 2010. For those who are new, "What is the Tasting Bee?" . . . It is the LWML spring fundraiser. This year's theme is "Tied to Mom's Apron Strings".

There are three ways to get involved in the Tasting Bee:

1. Co-Chairing a committee; desserts, kitchen, door prizes.

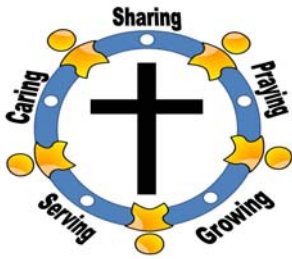

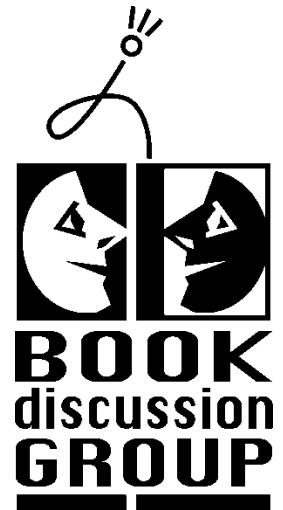

HAMMER OF GOD

The *HAMMER OF GOD* is a most remarkable novel. It has the drama, the suspense, the intensity, and the description of persons, of culture, and of nature. 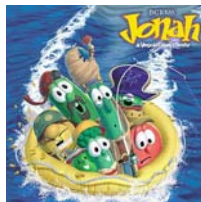
